THE PURPOSE OF THIS BOOKLET

We are putting these booklets together on our ancestors, not for the purpose of aiding in any genealogical research, although there might be that possibility for some readers. We are not making an effort to include all the names, dates, and places we might discover if we searched. We do not want to take that much time because of the magnitude of our task.

Our intention is to preserve the life stories of our ancestors as completely as we can. The family traditions, anecdotes, and accomplishments that might be lost to our posterity if we don't record them. There are also mementoes, certificates, photographs, especially photographs, that might be forever lost if we don't find a way to share them. This is our effort to do so.

We feel it is not an accident that so many family records have ended up in our hands from both sides of our families. We feel we have them because we will take care of them and share them. We are getting old and we realize that if we die without doing something about these family treasures, they will probably not be preserved for future generations. We're not sure how to share them but preparing these books and booklets is at least the first step. Our children or grandchildren may have to take it from there and we trust that they will.

The Life Story of Isaac Long & His Three Wives

Isaac Long's Parents -- His parents, Henry Long, and his wife, Mary (we do not know her last name), were married in North Carolina about 1784. About half of their 14 children were probably born there, in Orange County, before they moved to Claiborne County, Tennessee, it was said, about 1800. he had 10 brothers and 3 sisters. we do not know how many lived to maturity but there are death dates or approximated death dates for 9 of the 14. The family then relocated to Morgan County, Illinois, where they remained.

Morrison Cemetery — The parents and some of the children are buried in Morrison Cemetery, there in Morgan County, Illinois. This cemetery is not only badly neglected and grown over, it was vandalized. The cemetery was evidently plowed under. Some of the stones were broken up; many were piled up. An effort was made to restore the cemetery but it was still overgrown. It is in a farmer's field, which makes it difficult to acsess to maintain.

Parents' Birthplace -- Family sources give Louidoun, Virginia for the birthplace of Henry and North Carolina for Mary. However, the Federal Census gives the birthplace for both of them as Prussia.

The Will of Henry Long

Doesn't Name All The Heirs -- Henry's will is interesting and thoughtful. All heirs are considered, though unfortunately, not all by name. he names his son, Nicholas, and his wife, Mary. The relationships of John Long and W. H. Long are not given but are probably his sons John and William.

Content Of The Will -- In the name of God, Amen. I Henry Long of the County of Morgan and State of Illinois, being of sound and perfect mind and memory (blessed be God) do this 26th day of January in the year of our Lord, 1846, make and publish this my last Will and Testiment in manner as follows.

Farm To Nicholas -- First, I give unto my son, Nicholas Long, my farm consisting of 208 acres according to my deeds. Let there be more or less. By Nicholas keeping myelf and wife, furnish wood and feed for the cows and to pay \$550.00 at the end of 5 years from this date, without interest or rent till that time. And if I, Henry Long, live 6 years, then I reserve to myself the right to alter my will or not, just as I please. But if I die, he is to keep Mary Long as long as she lives, free of charge for and in consideration of my willing him the farm.

Nicholas to Care For Parents -- The said Nicholas is gto give his obligation to keep one or both of us as the case may be, and to pay \$550 to be equal divided among the balance of the heirs except Nicholas, as he is not to have any of this sum of money. When paid to the E hxecutor is to be divided amongst the balance. [Nicholas is one of the younger children.]

Executor -- I hereby appoint John Long my Executor of this my last Will and Testament. In witness whereof I, Henry Long, have to this last Will and Testament set my hand and affixed my seal the year and date written above. [John Long is an older child.]

Witnesses -- In the presence of W. H. Long and Nicholas Long." [W. H. Long could be his son, William.]

Isaac's First Wife, Elizabeth Greene

Photographs -- Unfortunately we have no photographs of Isaac's first two wives, Elizabeth Greene and Sarah James. There is, however, a lovely portrait of Sarah's parents.

Elizabeth and Isaac Were Young At Marriage -- Marriage records in Morgan County, Illinois show a marriage between Isaac Long, age 19 and Elizabeth Greene, aged 16 years, 11 months. Since they were both under age, their fathers had to sign for them, a blessing when doing genealogy. His parents we knew, Hers, we did not. Her father was Reynolds Greene and her mother, from other souces, was Frances Hall. Elizabeth was born on 21 Jun 1818, in Alabama. By the time Elizabeth was married in 1834, the Greene Family had also moved to Morgan County, Illinois. This marriage took place on 23 May 1834, and was performed by D. Waldo, A Justice of the Peace.

Elizabeth's Siblings -- We have sparse information on Elizabeth's birth family. One source we believe to be accurate [though we've mislaid the source]. Including Elizabeth, there were eight children, six girls and two boys: Nancy (b. 22Nov 1807), Margaret (b. 21 Nov 1809), William (b. 10 Oct 1812), Mary Ellen (b. 18 Apr 1816), **Elizabeth** (b. 21 Jun 1818), Matthew C. (b. 7 Aug 1820), Martha Caroline (b. 15 Nov 1822) and Sarah Frances (b. 7 Apr 1825).

Isaac and Elizabeth Left Illinois -- Their first two children were born in Illinois and then the family relocated to Van Buren County, Iowa. It would seem that the probable reason would have been for the opportunity to purchase land. The Federal Census and Isaac's Will give the information that Isaac was a farmer. There six more children joined the family for a total of eight. There were three boys: William M., Hosea H., and George M., and five girls: Mary Y., Sarah N., Martha L., Elizabeth Ann, and Miranda.

Elizabeth's Death – Elizabeth passed away on 3 April 1858 when her youngest child was only 10 years old. We can find no mention of the cause of her death. She was only 40 years old still had a family to raise. She is buried in Spencer Cemetery, Van Buren County, Iowa.


Isaac's Second Family

Sarah Ursula James – Almost a year after his first wife died, Isaac married **our** ancestor, Sarah James. For her, it was her first marriage, or at least we believe that to be the case. They were married in Jefferson County, Iowa on the 27th of March, 1859. She, having been born on January 18th, 1832, would have been 27 years of age.

Her Parents – Sarah's mother, Sally Clarke Wells, was from Athens, Ohio. Her father, Francis Puglsey James, was from York, Co., Maine. Because Sarah's father's mother was Mary Pugsley, a Pugsley genealogy booklet was handed down through the family and we are indebted to it for the record of Sarah's birth family.

The Pugsley and Long Descendency Booklets – The Long booklet has no obvious connection with our Longs. The Puglsey one does, however. Both are included in the back of this effort. They are not something we can dispose of as they may yet prove valuable to **our** descendants. This effort seems the most logical place to preserve both of them.

The Photograph of Sarah's Parents, Sally Clarke Wells, and Francis Pugsley James – As mentioned earlier, we have no pictures of either Elizabeth Greene or Sarah James. However, we feel very fortunate to have the likenesses of Sarah's parents.



Sarah's Siblings – Sarah was the second child of the family of 9 girls and 2 boys. Her brother, Elisha John, lived only 20 years. Joseph Orin lived only one day. Her sisters were: Mary Patience, Hannah Anne, Anna Marie, Marcia Frances, Eunice Margaret, Susan Almira, Esther Jane, and Sylvia Ellen

Sarah and Isaac's Family

Thirteen Children In All — Isaac had a total of 13 children with his two wives, Elizabeth and Sarah. Not many mementoes have been saved so it is with regret that we know little about these two mothers and many of the children. It seems certain that Sarah was a good step-mother to Elizabeth's young children.

Five Children With Sarah – Five children were born to this marriage including our ancestor, Clark Varnum Long, who was their youngest child. Sarah died on July 6th, 1877. She was 45 years of age and is also buried in Spencer Cemetery. Clarke was 8 ½ years old and Eunice Sidella (Della) only 12. Francis O. (Or Frank) would have been 16. The names of the other children were Sarintha (Sintha) Cerutha and Marsha (Marcy). Sarah must have named Eunice after her own sister, Eunice. Isaac still had children at home when he was widowed the second time. All of them were born in Jefferson County, Iowa.

Motherless Children – Just as Sarah had raised children from her husband's orphaned young children, she now was leaving behind children, she now was leaving behind children who also needed a mother.


Isaac's Third Wife

Savilla Ann Lee – Isaac's third wife was Savilla Ann Lee and she was the step-mother Clark remembered so fondly that he named his daughter (Savilla Evelyn Long, our ancestor) after her. Se was born in Iowa in 1854 so she was 40 years younger than Isaac. Perhaps he was tired of having his wives die on him. It seems probable that she was a sister to his son-in-law, Joshua Lee, who was married to his daughter, Sarintha. No children were born to this third marriage.

Marriage Date – You would think, this being the most recent, that we would have a marriage date for Isaac and Savilla. But we do not. We do know it was between July, 1877 when Isaac was widowed, and the 1880 Federal Census, where she was identified as his wife.

1880 Federal Census – They were living in Round Prairie Township, Jefferson County, Iowa. It showed: **Iaaac Long**, farmer, aged 66, born in Tennessee. **Anna** (Savilla Ann), his wife, aged 26, born in Iowa; **Della**, daughter, aged 14, born in Iowa, and **Clark**, son, aged 12 born in Iowa.

Family Photograph, this Time Period



This Photo Shows the Long Family as Represented in The 18890 Census, Plus Francis O. (Frank). In the Front are Isaac and Savilla. In back from left to right are Frank, Della and Clark.

This photo is very valuable to us because it gives such a clear likeness of Isaac, and at least one of his three wives.

Relationship With Step-Mother — Evidently Savilla was well liked by Isaac's children, in spite of her youth. Clark always spoke fondly of her to his children, and as mentioned earlier, even named his daughter after her. A few family letters survive that also indicate a closeness between Savilla and the children not much younger than her.

Mementos – Not many family mementoes have been saved and passed down by the Long Family and saved for the enjoyment of future generations. Therefore, we are all the more grateful for that which we have. As follows:



Half Brothers and Wives – We have wondered how close the children from Isaac's two families were to each other. Therefore, this picture of George Long (bottom left) from the first family and Frank Long (bottom right) from the second family is reassuring. Behind them are their wives, Mary P. (George's wife) and Annie Jones (Frank's wife).

Letter from Della

Clark's Daughter Wrote Her Mother's Sister – It is nice to know Sarah's grandchildren kept in touch with her family although they were not living near each other. Della's letter reads as follows:

Tingley, Ringgold Co., Iowa Saturday, May 17

Dear Aunt,

I will try and answer your most kind and welcome letter I received today. I was glad to hear from you but sorry to hear of your sickness. We are all well at present and hope this will find you the same. We moved this spring and we don't go to Mt. Ayr as often as we did. So I did not get your letter as soon as you expected I would.

Roy and Vick Jones rented a big farm together this year and me and Grandma Jones live in the same house. There are nine rooms in the house and we live in separate rooms. We have 10 cows and 5 horses. I have over 100 little chickens and 4 dozen old hens. I have most of my garden made.

I don't have time to write much this time. My little girl will be 2 years in July. Tell Aunt Eunice to write to me. Where does Millie live now? I did not know Ella was married before. You write soon and tell the girls to write and direct to Tingley. We get our mail there now. And tell that lawyer to send his letters there. It will be lots of help to me to get that money for we need it, you may know. I will close.

My love to all, from Della Russell. Goodby to her Aunt Marcia James"

[Grammar and punctuation corrected. The lawyer and money she referred to probably had to do with inheritance from her father, Isaac. His third wife had passed away and although she had announced her intention to leave everything to the children, her 2nd husband evidently received it and the children were trying to contest that, apparently without success.]

Letter Written by Step Mother

Evidence of Her Affection – This letter was written to Clark, March 9, 1918.

"Dear Son and Daughter,

I will write a few lines. I was glad to hear from you all one more time. We are not well. Rheumatism in my feet so bad I can't go out some of the time. We had some very cold weather, 32 degrees below zero yesterday. It cleared up and the sun came out. It looks nice today. There was about six inches of snow on the ground. Mr. Jenkins hasn't got all the corn gathered yet. He got sick. I had about a thousand bushels this year. Corn is 75 cents a bushel.

I haven't rented yet this year. I wish you had come on the old place. I can't get around and see after the place. I wouldn't let Mr. Jenkins have the place any more. He has had it for 3 years. I am a going to write to F. O. Long [Clark's brother]. I heard Della is dead but I don't think so. I haven't heard from Della for a long time.

I can't work to make any money anymore. I have to rent the place so as to get my living. I don't look to Mr. Layton [her husband] for any money no more than if he was not there. He don't spend a penny for me. I have to keep him. Instead of him keeping me, it goes the other way. He is the stingiest man I ever saw. I have made our living with my chickens ever since we've been married.

But I have got a little money put up for rainy days. He has got two hundred dollars of my money. I have got fourteen hundred out on interest besides what he has got.

I just heard Lillie James is dead. Annie Norine is in Ottumwa. She came there in the winter. I will close for this time. I got the cards you sent. They look nice. Write soon and often.

Picnic in the Woods



Priceless Photo – This wonderful photograph certainly seems unusual for its day. At first we only noticed the men in the center but closer scrutiny revealed figures to the left and the right. The picture was labeled "Picnic in the Woods." The men were identified as Frank Long, LeRoy Russell (Della's husband), Clark Long, and the old man in the center back, Isaac Long, the father. The women on the left, with food in their hands are almost certainly Della and the step mother, Savilla. But there's another figure on the far right, see the long gun barrel? We believe it is probably George Long, one of the younger men from Isaac's first family.

No More Details on Lives of These Progenitors – And although they seem sparse, we are happy to know as much as we do. We can imagine Isaac's sorrow at the loss of his two wives and his enjoyment of his large family. His death certificate reveals that he died of paralysis, so we can also imagine the suffering and difficulty of his last days.

Isaac's Death and Burial—Isaac lived until he was past the age of 84 years and died on December 16, 1898. He is buried in Spencer Cemetery in Van Buren County, Iowa, as are all three of his wives. Savilla, however, remarried, so her last name was then Layton. This was not a happy marriage and she is said to be buried beside Isaac. We hope someone in the family will visit that cemetery to obtain pictures of the tombstones.

(O) THE LONG COAT OF ARMS

A Coat of Arms is an emblem which is displayed by titled persons, persons of royal blood, and their descendants.

Coats of Arms were orginally used for purposes of identification and recognition on the field of battle as well as in civil life.

It is claimed by some writers that Coats of Arms, in a crude form, were used by Noah's sons after the flood. There are records of other Coats of Arms, in one crude form or another, at different periods of ancient history. Heraldry, however, as we know it today, did not become of much importance until soon after the invasion of England by William the Conqueror, A. D. 1066. Heraldry became of general interest at about the time of the Crusades.

The Long Coat of Arms shown on the cover of this volume has been in use by the Long Families for many centuries. It was used by the Long family of Wraxall, Wiltshire, which goes back to JOHN LONG, who died A. D. 1597. (See Chapter (C)—A101.)

This Coat of Arms is described in references 2, 4 and 6, and in other reliable works on heraldry (in heraldic parlance) as follows:

Arms: Sa. within two flaunches and semee of cross-crosslets or, a lion rampant argent.

Crest: A lion's head arg., erased or, holding in the mouth a dexter hand erased gu.

Motto: Pieux Quoique Preux. (Pious though valiant.)

Sir Bernard Burke, of Heralds College, London, said, "Heraldry is prized by all who can show honorable ancestry or wish to found honorable families."

Many Americans are today displaying Coats of Arms which have been adopted by their progenitors in Europe.





CHARLES EDWARD (1796–1861), genealogist and antiquary: b. at Benham Park, Berkshire; s. Charles Beckford L—— of Langley Hall; Edward L——, the historian of Jamaica, was his grandfather; educated at Harrow School and Trinity College, Cambridge, where he gained a declamation prize, and in July 1818 won the chancellor's gold medal for English verse; he materially assisted Dr. Butler in his biographical notes to the lists of Harrow scholars; during many years he was a correspondent of the Gentleman's Magazine, and the leading antiquarian periodicals; with the assistance of Sir Charles George Young, Garter, Long compiled in 1845 a volume called "Royal Descents; a genealogical List of the several Persons entitled to quarter the Arms of the Royal Houses of England"; he made "Genealogical Collections of Jamaica Families", which he presented to the British Museum, and he also gave to the Museum many valuable documents relating to Jamaica.

Edward (1734–1813), author: b. Roselyon St. Blazey, Cornwall; s. Samuel L—— of Longville, Jamaica, Tredudwell in Cornwall and Queen Square, Bloomsbury, London; was entered at Gray's Inn, 1753; went to Jamaica on his father's death and filled the post of private secretary to Sir Henry Moore, baronet, the then lieutenant-governor, who had married his sister; in a short time he was promoted to judge of the vice-admiralty court in Jamaica; his chief work was the "History of Jamaica"; his son, Charles Edward L——, gave it to the British Museum.

EDWIN LONGSDEN (1829-1891), painter and royal academician: b. Bath; s. of E. Long, an artist; studied in the British Museum, London; making the acquaintance of John Phillip, R. A., he accompanied that artist to Spain, where they spent much time; his first important pictures were "The Suppliants" (1872) and "The Babylonian Marriage Market", both subsequently purchased by Thomas Holloway; elected associate of the Royal Academy, 1876, and an academician in 1881; his "Diana and Christ" (1881) greatly enhanced his reputation; he exhibited his next pictures in his own gallery in Bond Street and there, in 1883, and following years, his "Anno Domini" and "Zeuxis at Crotona" met with great success; besides the "Edwin Long" Gallery in Old Bond Street, a number of his pictures were collected together after his death and formed the nucleus of a gallery of Christian art; his best portrait was of Cardinal Manning.

George (1780–1868), police magistrate: s. Joseph L—— of Shopwick, Sussex; admitted to Gray's Inn, 1806, and called to the bar, 1811; appointed magistrate at Great Marlborough Street police court, 1839.

SIR JAMES (1617–1692), royalist: s. Sir Walter L—— of Draycot Cerne, Wiltshire; b. South Wraxhall, Wiltshire; it appears that he entered the royal army and is probably the Captain Long who served in Sir Thomas Glemham's regiment at the beginning of the Civil War; appointed sheriff of Wiltshire in the king's interest, 1644; early in 1645 he escorted the Prince of Wales to Bristol and was leisurely returning eastwards when he was overtaken by a superior force of parliamentarians under Waller and Cromwell at Devizes; he fell rapidly back towards Bath, hotly pursued by Waller; near Potterne he was intercepted by Cromwell, and the high thick-set hedges prevented his escape; he was captured but was soon exchanged; he was something of an antiquary, and in a letter to Aubrey, preserved in the Bodleian Library,

dated 1688, there is an interesting description by Long of a number of Roman coins found at Heddington, Wiltshire.

James (1814–1887), missionary: ordained priest in the Church of England, 1840, and about 1846 went to India as a missionary in the service of the Church Missionary Society, being stationed at Thakurpukur, a village in the district of the Twenty-four Parganas, near Calcutta; as he had spent some part of his early life in Russia, he was well known at the Russian court, and kept up his connections there; in his writings he dwelt on the similarity between the social system and folklore of that country and India; he was a member of the Bengal Asiatic Society and a fellow of the Royal Geographical Society.

JOHN (1548-1589), archbishop of Armagh: b. London; educated at Eton; admitted a scholar, King's College, Cambridge, 1564; promoted to the see of Armagh and primacy of all Ireland, 1584; made a member of the privy council in Ireland, 1585.

JOHN ST. JOHN (1798-1834), empiric: s. John L—— of Newcastle, County Limerick; attended the Dublin school of design, 1816; in 1822 he went to London, where he exchanged art for medicine.

SIR LISLEBONE (1613–1659), speaker of the House of Commons: s. William L—— of Stratton, Somerset; graduated B. A., from Magdalen Hall, Oxford, 1630–31, and was called to the bar at Gray's Inn, 1640; attained distinction as a lawyer and in 1656 became recorder of London, a master of requests, and treasurer of Lincoln's Inn; knighted by Cromwell, 1655; member of parliament in House of Commons for Wells, and for Somerset.

SIR ROBERT (d. 1673), auditor of the exchequer: s. Sir Walter L—of Wraxhall and Draycot in Wiltshire; member of parliament for Devizes, 1625, for Midhurst, Sussex, 1640, and for Boroughbridge, Yorkshire, 1661; held office of surveyor of the queen's lands; in 1644 he became secretary of the council for the Prince of Wales; at the Restoration he was made a baronet, 1660; chancellor of the exchequer, 1660-7; made auditor of the exchequer, 1662; on Sept. 22, 1670, Charles II granted him a long lease of the Great Park, Great Park Meadow, and a house called Worcester House, all at Nonsuch, Surrey; became a privy councillor, 1672; was buried in Westminster Abbey.

the historian of Jamaica; b. Seale, Surrey; educated at Harrow School and the University of Gottingen; following are some of his engagements: in Flanders with the Duke of York, 1793-4; in the winter retreat to Germany, 1794-5, deputy adjutant-general to General Sir George Don; at Portsmouth as brigade-major and aide-de-camp to General Sir William Pitt; in Ireland, 1798, in command of mounted riflemen under General (Sir John) Moore in Wexford; at Weymouth in command of the York hussars, a very fine corps of cavalry; in Spain, 1808, as colonel of the staff; at Corunna, 1809; as adjutant-general to Lord Chatham at Walcheren, 1809; with Wellington at Portugal, 1810, with General William Carr Beresford in the affairs of Campo Maior and Los Santos; with Sir Rowland Hill in the operations of 1811-12; commanded a brigade of light dragoons at the battle of Vittoria (gold medal) and in Hill's

Timothy L—— (1610–1691); he served as lieutenant in Colonel Edward D'Oyley's regiment, in the expedition, under Penn and Venables, which conquered Jamaica in 1655 and was appointed secretary to Cromwell's commissioners; he received large grants of land in Jamaica and by 1661 was clerk of the House of Assembly; in 1671 he was acting as judge for the parishes of Clarendon and St. Elizabeth; he was elected to the Assembly as member for Clarendon, 1672, having then acquired the rank of captain, and was chosen speaker; in 1674 he was returned member for St. Katherine and reappointed speaker; on Aug. 14, 1674, being then colonel, he was sworn of the council and appointed chief justice; he was buried in the cathedral in St. Katherine's parish.

Thomas (1621–1707), divine: s. "Mr. Richard Lonng"; b. Exeter; he became a servitor of Exeter College, Oxford, and graduated B. A., 1642; became in 1652 vicar of St. Lawrence Clyst, near Exeter, and, being a staunch churchman and royalist, he lay under a long sequestration during the troubles, upholding the interests of the king and the church by constant preaching and writing; at the Restoration he was created B. D. of Oxford, by royal mandate, on September 20, 1660, and prebendary of Exeter Cathedral on January 18, 1660–1661; in 1684 he declined Sancroft's offer of the bishopric of Bristol on account, it is said, of his age and large family; he was proctor

for the clergy of his diocese (Exeter) in convocation in 1689, in 1693 and 1694; he was well read in both ancient and modern literature and was a voluminous controversial writer; he was firmly persuaded that Charles I was the author of the "Eiken Basilike", and in support of this view took part in the war of pamphlets which followed the publication of Walker's "True Account of the Author," in 1692; he wrote many works on religion.

WILLIAM (1817–1886), antiquary: s. Walter L—— of Corhampton, Hampshire; his mother was Lady Mary, eldest daughter of William Carnegie, seventh Earl of Northesk; he matriculated from Balliol College, Oxford, 1835, graduated B. A. in 1839, and proceeded M. A. in 1844; he was a justice of the peace for Somerset, an F. S. A., and passed his life as a country gentleman and a local antiquary.

In 1924, he was defeated in a three-man race for Governor of Louisiana, but four years later, in another three-man race, he won the Governorship by 40,000. At the age of thirty-five, he was one of the youngest State Governors in the United States.

(0) THE LONG COAT OF ARMS

A Coat of Arms is an emblem which is displayed by titled persons, persons of royal blood, and their descendants.

Coats of Arms were orginally used for purposes of identification and

It is claimed by some writers that Coats of Arms, in a crude form, were used by Noah's sons after the flood. There are records of other Coats of Arms, however, as we know it today, did not become of much importance until soon in one crude form or another, at different periods of ancient history. Heraldry, after the invasion of England by William the Conqueror, A. D. 1066. Heraldry became of general interest at about the time of the Crusades. recognition on the field of battle as well as in civil life.

The Long Coat of Arms shown on the cover of this volume has been in use by the Long Families for many centuries. It was used by the Long family of Wraxall, Wiltshire, which goes back to JOHN LONG, who died A. D. 1597. (See Chapter (C)—A101.)

This Coat of Arms is described in references 2, 4 and 6, and in other reliable works on heraldry (in heraldic parlance) as follows: Arms: Sa. within two flaunches and semee of cross-crosslets or, a lion rampant

Crest: A lion's head arg., erased or, holding in the mouth a dexter hand erased gu.

Motto: Pieux Quoique Preux. (Pious though valiant.)
